

# **The Ark of the New Covenant**

In January 2003, after his Pastor preached about dreams and visions, Doyle Shockley in his prayer time, asked the Lord to give him a vision, which He did.

The Lord gave Doyle a vision to build an Ark of the Covenant, which would be called “The Ark of the New Covenant” representing the Old and New Covenant.

He showed him in this vision, where He wanted the Ark to go. He wanted it taken to the steps of every state capitol, where the people of each state could pray for the safety of that state, the nation and our leaders. The Pastors of the particular state are to anoint and pray for anyone who needs prayer, believing for many to be saved, praying for revival in our nation, praying for all to be healed and needs to be met.

The Ark of the New Covenant is only a tool or symbol being used to bring people to Christ, it merely reflects the old and the new. The message is all about Christ and what He has done for us. Since the veil was rent at Calvary, we now all have access to the Holy of Holies, the very Throne Room of God.

The Lord gave specific instructions on how the Ark was to be made, described as follows:

- (1) The box is made in the same dimensions as the original Ark.
- (2) This box was to be made out of different types of wood representing all the nationalities of the world.
- (3) The Cherubim on top of the ark are made out of solid Maple (a yellow gold wood) representing the Asian people.
- (4) The Mercy Seat is out of White Pine and represents the Caucasian people.
- (5) The box itself is made out of Black Walnut and represents the black people.
- (6) The borders around the box are made out of Cyprus wood which represents the brown people.
- (7) The legs of the box are out of Red Oak representing the indian people.
- (8) The rope molding inlaid into the Black Walnut represents the rope that was used to make the scourging whip used on Christ’s back at the crucifixion.
- (9) The two circles of Myrtle Wood that are on the front and back of the box represent the eternity of Christ.
- (10) The knots in the Cyprus Wood represent the imperfections of our life.

The Lord gave specific instructions about the contents of the Ark, described as follows:

- (1) On the Mercy Seat between the Cherubim is the anointing vessel.
- (2) Inside the Ark on one side are the articles representing the Old Covenant: Golden Jar of Manna, Ten Command-ments in stone and Aaron’s Almond Rod that budded.
- (3) On the other side are the articles representing the New Covenant: The wine representing the Blood of Christ, the bread representing the body of Christ, the spikes used to nail Christ to the cross, the scourging rod used on Christ’s Body for our healing, the Cross and the crown of thorns placed on Christ’s Head.
